Treasurer's Report

- Northern Tier: Everyone with reimbursements larger than \$100 have been paid out.
- Finances are down because of reimbursements.
- Fund 1.5 high adventure camperships every trip.
- Rechartering: up to date at \$4,000
- Camperships: over \$2,200. We can push for financially strapped scouts to go on trips.
- Scout accounts: a little over \$5,500.
- Total bucket to play with: \$6,000.
- 9-10k per year burn rate
- This is all normal for where we are in the year.
- Did a survey of list of possible summer camp destinations:
 - Camp William Hinds, Raymond, ME 140m away, has Friday evening departure. Not ideal.
 - o 3 places offer 10 or more eagle req; others offer 5 or 6. Many do not offer cooking merit badge.
